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## Pop in NJ: Molly Pitcher Inn and Oyster Point Hotel

The Molly Pitcher Inn and Oyster Point Hotel, sister locations almost side-by-side overlooking the Navesink River in Red Bank, are musts if you're staying in the area or planning a function. I lost count of the weddings I saw come in and out of the place (OK maybe it was the same wedding with guests lingering) and why shouldn't that be the case. It's two unique locals to spend your special day.

Let's get into Molly Pitcher first. Comfy leather armchairs greet you in the lobby and that's just the start. A luxurious hotel with bed and breakfast charm, the elegant 19th century small luxury hotel provides grandiose and spacious guest rooms, first-class service (front desk staff were tops), a killer pool (crap weather be damned), and a fine dining room (try the pot pie!)

In contrast, the Oyster Point Hotel is more contemporary with modern decor. The south suite is hip with a flat-screen TV mounted on the wall, spacious design with elegant modern furniture and small sculptures. The fitness center struck me instantly in that it overlooks the river. Talk about an inspiring as you work up a sweat. Amazing water views surround this hotel thanks to larger windows. The lobby radiates with a fireplace lounge and Pearl restaurant nearby. The interesting menu includes Thai Chili Papaya Glazed Tilapia. The french toast for breakfast, by the way, a white chocolate brioche sweet cream and berries may be the best I've ever eaten. And, I've got a lot of french toast miles – whatever that means, but you get it.

This post doesn't begin to touch the surface. I guess what it comes down to is overall both hotels are different but offer the same, rewarding experience.
